The TDMP program has successfully received grant funding approaching a total of \$200,000 in the last four years, which has gone a long way towards updating computers and equipment

used by students. The Remote Production trailer underwent changes this summer, as almost \$70,000 of upgrades were made as part of Ferris State's return to the CCHA. 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REMEMBERING JIM BREAULT

Before James Breault (1935-2021) came to Ferris and, along with the Dean of the College of Education Tom Cook, created the TV Production program, he spent more than 15 years in TV news. As an award-winning television producer, he covered parades, Lions games, and the Detroit riots for WDIV-TV.

He started in live production, moved to film, and eventually videotape as he created scheduled programs and documentaries both in the studio and on location.

In 1974, Jim started at Ferris and became the first TVP faculty member and internship coordinator. He was instrumental in forming the program into what it is today, including its focus on internships. During his time teaching in TVP, enrollment exploded to 143 students. In 1988, TVP was changed from a junior-senior level program to the four year program it is today.

It was Jim's belief that no matter where they came from or how they were raised, every child deserved a quality education. With nearly 400 TVP graduates during his tenure, Jim Breault clearly left an indelible imprint on the Ferris community.

TVP/TDMP EMERITI SCHOLARSHIP

As a way to help students and honor faculty who have impacted our graduates, the TDMP program has begun fundraising for the **TVP/TDMP Emeriti Scholarship.**

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This scholarship will honor the memory of Jim Breault, Bob Hunter, and Leigh Caskey as well as show appreciation to recent emeriti Clayton Rye, Fred Wyman, Steve Cox, and Connie Morcom. The needs-based scholarship will be awarded to deserving students in the TDMP program and can be used for tuition, supplies, or equipment (sure we don't have to buy tapes anymore, but one can never have too many SD cards and hard drives).

LEARNING

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The new three-story Center for Virtual Learning building is under construction, and on target for a scheduled opening in fall 2023. Needless to say, we are highly anticipating this move! Seeing the building go up is the culmination of four years of discussion and planning.

The third floor of the new Center for Virtual Learning will offer School of Digital Media students five new labs, five distinct video editing suites, two sound booths, a green screen studio, and two classrooms. These spaces will be purpose-built, rather than retrofitted, and are designed to offer students practical experience that

best mirrors the real-world work environment. The television studio is the only learning space that will remain in the IRC building, as it is equipped and situated better there then it could have been in the new building.

The third floor will add advanced motion capture and virtual reality capabilities and equipment to better attract and retain students, while offering multi-disciplinary learning opportunities across the School. The new space will remain accessible 24 hours a day, seven days a week – but with a card-key entry system that will better serve students (vs. checking out keys). After years of being in different

buildings, TDMP faculty offices will once again be in close proximity to learning spaces, which will amplify opportunities for faculty to support students. This is a big highlight of the new space! Fundraising efforts are underway, including naming rights for various learning spaces across the third floor. GRANT FUNDING

TDMP has benefitted from several non-traditional funding opportunities and this past December, we were awarded a grant totaling nearly \$114,000.00! As with any funding opportunity, we try to identify our most pressing needs and balance them against items needed to keep our students up to date with the latest gear. The following list is just a sample of some of our new equipment:

- -2 New Miller Combo Pedestals for the TV Studio
- -LED lighting for the Studio Grid with DMX controller
- -2 Ronin RS2 DJI gimbals
- -2 Sony 70-200mm f2.8 lenses for sports highlights
- -Lillitput 21" color correct producer monitor

- New softboxes for all light kits
- -10 iMac's for IRC156 (photography, Online Media Management & Audio classes)
- -NewTek 3Play replay system for the remote production trailer

In addition to this funding opportunity, the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) helped us upgrade our remote production equipment. Providing us with new cameras to cover hockey (we now have 11 total cameras covering the game). We also purchased PZM mics, IFBs, a new Broadcast Pix Granite video switcher, a Daktronics AJT graphics computer and much more.

The 21st annual Ferris Media Festival takes place on FRIDAY, APRIL 8, 2022. Producing this event requires an entire aca-


demic year's worth of organizing and fundraising, and an impressive array of speakers from across the Digital Media industry will present at this year's event:
